

Women's lives matter! Women groups with political and economic autonomy and access to human rights. Combating racism and machismo.



NUMBERS

Last year, FASE's measures reached:

- ▶ 19,296 people directly (63% women)
- ▶ 3,129 families assisted with agroecological practices in the states of Bahia, Mato Grosso, Espírito Santo and Pará
- ▶ 120 women's organizations (1,300 women)
- ▶ 340 associations and movements promoting public policies
- ▶ Around 58,000 people indirectly benefited



FASE AND COVID-19

FASE promoted humanitarian actions with several partners between 2020 and 2022:

- ▶ Direct support to 17,500 families (around 70,000 people) and more 83,000 people indirectly benefited
- ▶ Purchase of 18,457 food baskets, mostly from family farming
- ▶ FASE's measures deployed 147 partners and raised R\$ 2.63 million in resources for 9 states, 108 cities, 378 neighborhoods, suburban areas, rural communities and villages



DISTRIBUTION OF

- ▶ 13,271 kits with masks, hand sanitizer, drinking water and soaps
- ▶ 2,750 cooking gas vouchers

DONATION OF

- ▶ 276 kits with clothes, sheets, bath towels, diapers
 - ▶ 3,255 pans
 - ▶ 158 furniture and mattresses
 - ▶ 107 refrigerators and stoves

MEASURES



AGROECOLOGICAL AMAZON

Economic practices and agroecological measures implemented at the regions of lower Tocantins, lower Amazon, Cuiabá Lowlands and Cáceres to fight against climate changes by the conservation and sustainable use of biodiversity, guarantee of food security and lands rights for rural agro-extractive producers, quilombolas, indigenous people and family farming in the states with the greater deforestation rates in Legal Amazon.

- ▶ **73 BENEFITED COMMUNITIES** in the states of Pará and Mato Grosso
- ▶ **2,250 FAMILIES ADDRESSED FOCUSING** mainly in women (59%) and young people (40%)
- ▶ **685 HECTARES OF PRODUCTIVE BACKYARDS** agricultural areas, vegetable gardens and arboreal species

- ▶ **450K SEEDLINGS OF FRUITFUL** and forest species
- ▶ **7 AREAS OF SPRINGS** recovered
- ▶ **178 AGROFORESTRY** subsystems
- ▶ **99 SEEDS, SEEDLINGS AND NATIVE MANIOCS** mapped and kept in the community
- ▶ Development of 6 Technical notes/booklets, as well as schedules, workbook, agroecological booklets and other supporting graphic materials, 4 training videos about agroecological practices and women importance to safeguard sociobiodiversity and other learning materials.



PRODUCTIVE BAHIA

Strengthened family farming organizations at 10 cities in the state of Bahia, selling their products, dealing with more sustainable techniques at crops and cattle farming, such as plantation diversification, crop rotation and biomass management to improve soil fertility, avoiding erosion and conserving hydric resources.

URBAN AGRICULTURE AND LIVING WELL

FASE pursuit to promote welfare in cities areas and assists in cultivating crops and gardens in suburban areas at the Metropolitan Zone of Recife.

- ▶ **15 COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS** based on practices of mutual support, as collective efforts for farming

- ▶ **320 PEOPLE BENEFITED**
110 are women and their families in Recife

- ▶ **4 COMMUNITY GARDENS** serving 5 communities – 3 in urban occupation areas

- ▶ **1 COOPERATIVE KITCHEN** attending 150 people

YOUTH IN THE CITIES

It strengthens the protagonism of youth in the defense of their rights, identifies alternatives for economic inclusion, and promotes the rights of young people in Rio de Janeiro and Pernambuco.

- ▶ **53 GROUPS OF YOUNGSTERS AND WOMEN** in the states of Rio de Janeiro and Pernambuco, engaged around the rights of youth, fight urban inequality and in defense of access to the job market
- ▶ **715 DIRECTLY BENEFITED** and others 1,500 indirectly benefited
- ▶ **9 GROUPS** with projects approved in national public notices
- ▶ **YOUTH ARTICULATED IN THE CAMPAIGN** “Young People for the Right to Live”
- ▶ **TRAINING COURSES** with 12 youth groups in Rio de Janeiro

SEWING FASHION WITH RIGHTS

Support to mobilize and survey the women's living and work conditions in the confectionery industry in the states of Rio de Janeiro and Pernambuco, enhancing knowledge and reflection about the business model of fashion industry and how it has historically affected these women's work.

- ▶ Political and artistic interventions in mass-circulation urban areas



LAND RIGHTS

Support to traditional communities in defense of their territories, implementation and visibility of land use alternatives through the development of Free, Prior and Informed Consultation Protocols set forth in the Convention 169 from International Labour Organization (ILO) – a powerful tool of territorial protection, which contributes to enhance and acknowledge the voice of those communities jeopardized by enterprises and projects violating their rights and lifestyle, for example, through mining and oil.

▶ 16 COMMUNITIES SUPPORTED BY FASE AT PARÁ AND ESPÍRITO SANTO

to develop their Free, Prior and Informed Consultation Protocols, including: 1 indigenous land, 8 quilombolas lands and 7 agro-extractive communities, directly reaching 28,072 people



SOCIAL CARTOGRAPHY

Collective subjects (women groups, populations affected by large projects) build risk maps and resistance plans to support marginalized areas by implementing participatory workshops.

- ▶ **RISK MAPS OF NATURAL DISASTERS** and productive capacities in three traditional communities from Pará
- ▶ **CHANGES AND RESISTANCES MAP** in the port areas from Rio de Janeiro
- ▶ **DEVELOPMENT AND INSTITUTIONAL VIOLENCE IMPACTS MAP** in the lives of women residents in Caju and Manguinhos, at Rio de Janeiro
- ▶ **SERVICE FLOWS MAP** for women from 8 collective movements from Maré and Manguinhos slums at Rio de Janeiro

INTERNATIONAL MEASURES

- ▶ Since 2008, FASE has been monitoring international negotiations about climate change in the scope of UNFCCC (United Nations Climate Change Conference) and has been attending COP (Conference of the Parties), approaching mainly subjects about land use, forests, and agriculture.
- ▶ FASE operates through national and international networks to articulate and to predict climate change, EU-Mercosur agreement and the effects of agribusiness and oil industry
- ▶ Takes part in Pan-Amazon Social Forum (FOSPA) mentoring, since it began 20 years ago, in the scope of World Social Forum, bringing together people and movements in the defense of Amazônia
